
CHARTER SCHOOL ACCOUNTABILITY IN NEW JERSEY

CHARTER SCHOOLS are THE MOST HIGHLY ACCOUNTABLE PUBLIC SCHOOLS in the state of New Jersey

- 1. Charter schools run on performance contracts that focus on student outcomes.
- 2. Charter schools receive annual audits conducted by NJDOE and an independent fiscal auditor based on the Performance Framework.
- 3. If charter schools fail to provide a quality education to students, they are forced to close.
- 4. If traditional districts were measured against the standards within the Performance Framework, dozens of struggling districts would be forced to close.

Charter schools are public schools



DISTRICT VS. CHARTER ACCOUNTABILITY

DISTRICT (QSAC)

Oversight Every 3 Years

Focused on inputs/compliance

Consequence of failure: submission of improvement plans (failing districts are never closed)

CHARTER (PERFORMANCE FRAMEWORK)

Oversight Annually

Focused on student outcomes

Consequence of failure: school closure (more than 20 since 2010)

Note: QSAC and the Performance Framework are formal oversight tools required by NJ statute and regulation.
